October 9, 2023 Town Council Approved Minutes

- <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Mayor Whited opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m. Council members Drew Beard, Fred Catlin, Jean Goodine, Brad Schneider and Gail Swift were present, with Patrick O'Connell absent. Town Attorney Martin Crim and Town Administrator/Clerk Barbara Batson were present.
- <u>APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA</u>: Mayor Whited requested item (c) calendar change to avoid meeting on Columbus Day, be added under New Business. Mr. Catlin made a motion to approve the amended agenda and Ms. Swift seconded and a roll call vote was taken:

Mr. Catlin voted "yes"
Mr. Schneider voted "yes"

And the motion passed 6-0, with Mr. O'Connell absent.

 MINUTES: Ms. Goodine motioned to accept the minutes for September 11, 2023 Ms. Swift seconded and a roll call vote was taken:

Ms. Swift voted "yes" Mayor Whited voted "yes"

And the motion passed 6-0, with Mr. O'Connell absent.

REPORTS:

<u>Mayor's Report:</u> Mayor Whited reported that the valve repair that was scheduled to happen last week was not completed. There was a problem with the contractor being able to access the valve, but the work is being rescheduled. This repair will not affect water service to the town.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Ms. Swift reported that the sewer bond payment is due and we currently still owe 1.2 million.

<u>Town Attorney</u>: Mr. Crim reported that he has worked with Black Kettle LLC's. attorney on language for the petition for a boundary line adjustment for Rush River Commons Phase II. He feels they have come to a common agreement and are sending the document to Mr. Art Goff for review.

Mr. Brown, who represents Mr. Drew Mithcell, is reviewing the proposed Leggett Lane Road maintenance agreement. Mr. Catlin asked if we have contacted the new property owner for the Post Office and Mr. Crim said they have not been able to locate the new owner.

Mr. Crim also reported that he was working on an encroachment license agreement with Black Kettle LLC. for the landscaping they want to do on town property on Leggett Lane. Mr. Catlin asked if a tree fell on a car, who would be responsible? Mr. Crim said, that the liability would fall on Black Kettle LLC. They would have the responsibility moving forward to maintain the trees and other plantings.

Zoning Administrator: Mr. Steve Gyurisin reported that a letter went out to the new owner of the post office, asking the new owner to provide us with the paperwork to complete the road maintenance agreement. Mr. Schneider asked how long has it been that Mr. Gyurisin has been trying to contact the owner. Mr. Gyurisin said it's been six months. Mr. Schneider suggested that if we didn't hear back by December that the town should take legal steps. He emphasized this issue needed to be resolved. Mr. Crim added that there is a health and safety issue because an occupancy permit has not been issued.

<u>Planning Commission (PC)</u>: There was not a report. The next meeting is a walking tour on October 28 at 12:00 p.m.

<u>Architectural Review Board (ARB)</u>: There was no report. The next meeting is on October 16.

OLD BUSINESS: There was no old business.

NEW BUSINESS:

(a) <u>Utilities application for Rush River Commons:</u> Mayor Whited shared that Rush River Commons is applying for two water and sewer taps. He reported that a capacity study was done on the water and wastewater systems and if both taps are approved, it would take us up to 40% usage of our capacity. He also reminded TC that any fees associated with these two taps would be assigned for usage to maintain the water and wastewater systems. Ms. Goodine shared that she found the report very encouraging.

Ms. Swift made a motion to approve the application submitted by Rush River Commons for two water and sewer taps and Mr. Catlin seconded and a roll call vote was taken:

And the motion passed 6-0, with Mr. O'Connell absent.

(b) Landscape plan for Rush River Commons: Mr. Gyurisin reported there has been a change to the landscape plan for Rush River Commons. A portion of the landscaping with be on town property. The changes will be added as an addendum to the approved site plan with Town Council's approval. Ms. Goodine expressed a concern about the width of Leggett Lane. She said the landscaping goes into the shoulder along the road. Mr. Steve Plescow responded that the road would still be 18 ft. wide with a 3-inch shoulder on both sides of the road.

Mr. Catlin said that the Virginia Department of Transportation recommends a road be at least 18 to 24 ft. wide, he asked how wide the road is to the post office entrance. Mr. Gyurisin responded that it was in the 18 to 24 ft. range. Mr. Gyurisin also said it's important to make sure

there is no conflict with the water and sewer lines running up Leggett Lane. Ms. Goodine asked why there were larger trees closer to the road and boxwoods behind them. Mr. Gyurisin said it was to help block car lights. Mr. Catlin asked if Rush River Commons would be responsible for maintaining the plantings and Mr. Gyurisin said they would.

Ms. Swift made a motion:

- 1. to allow the developer of Rush River Commons Phase 1 and Leggett Lane Improvements, Black Kettle, LLC, to utilize a portion of the Town owned property for the placement of landscaping.
- 2. to authorize Mayor Whited to enter into a formal agreement with Black Kettle, LLC. for the installation and long-term maintenance of the landscaping.
- 3. to have Black Kettle LLC. prepare such an agreement to be reviewed by the Town Attorney prior to the Mayor's approval.
- 4. to confirm that the Zoning Administrator may approve the latest version of the landscape plan with the understanding that the agreement is in proper form and that the landscape plan review comments are addressed by the landscape designer.

and Mr. Catlin seconded, and added an amendment that the road must be a minimum of 18 ft. wide; Ms. Swift approved the amendment to her motion and a roll call vote was taken:
